The music department is a fantastic place to be right now: a fun and varied curriculum, a major refurb of the department and playing live is inspiring our musicians as they study the broad spectrum of music ranging from world and historical music to digital audio workshop projects.

A big welcome to Mrs Cheetham, who joined the music teaching team in September. We are very lucky to have her. Her arrival has not only enabled Year 7 and 8 pupils to increase their lessons from one to two hours per fortnight, but has also created more time for focus on specialisms including performance and music history.

Inspired by the training, the leaders ran lunch time activities for a group of Year 7 students which was not only fun, but also encouraged the new pupils to feel part of school life in their first term.

The sessions were a hit and the Year 8 Campion Students showed what great role models they are. The project finished with a camera crew visiting, see above, from the Youth Sports Trust interviewing the students and to hear about the project. Some staff were brave enough to step in front of the camera too. The project was a real success.

Primary School Rowers row fifty miles

At the beginning of the year Campion hosted three AMAZING Primary Schools Rowing Competitions for Central and Southern Warwickshire Schools, pictured below. During the School Games event the young people from twenty different schools rowed nearly fifty miles.

Twenty boys teams and twenty-two girls teams took part involving 168, Year 6 students. The groups showed great teamwork skills as they encouraged their classmates, along with the teachers who were helping to motivate the young people to achieve their best. It was quite possibly the loudest competition we have ever run at Campion, but the noise was worth it as we all had so much fun. Well done to everyone involved in helping to ensure this event was such a positive experience for everyone involved.



NEW LIFE-SAVING DEFIBILLATOR

In November, Campion School was kindly awarded a grant to purchase a heart defibrillator to be sited next to the new Sports Hall. Due to the expansion of the school, along with the school's renewed capacity to hire out facilities for local community sports groups, it was agreed that a defibrillator would be necessary. Local groups who will benefit from this include: Leamington Brakes FC, Little Kickers and JayKays Dance Company.

The benefits of a defibrillator are wide-ranging and it offers peace of mind for participants. If a defibrillator is used within 3-5 minutes of a cardiac arrest, **survival** rates can jump impressively from 6% to 74%.

'The machine is easy to use for all age groups and training is not required. It is good to have it on site.' Assistant Headteacher Nick Hawkins commented.

Thank you to Whitnash Councillor and School Governor Judy Falp, and Warwickshire County Council for this vital piece of life-saving equipment.

WHAT IS SMSC? HOW DOES IT AFFECT ME?

Over the next few newsletters we will look at this important subject in more detail. SMSC stands for Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Development.
