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# FOCUS ON ART



Ten panels have been painted for the Rehab Hospital in Learnington Spa. Luke Allsopp, Y8, explained why the artwork was being done.

This project is being funded with the money raised for my father, Martin Allsopp. Dad worked at the Leamington Rehabilitation Hospital, where my mum, Jean, also works as a healthcare assistant.

On 15 January 2021 Dad started to show symptoms of Covid-19. He

fought the virus tooth and nail - for sixteen days - as he promised he would - but, the damage done to his lungs was too great and the decision to spare him anymore pain was made. We said goodbye to my Dad on 9 February 2021.

The initial panels the family have seen look brilliant and we can't wait to see it when it's finished. It's a fantastic project for the patients and we know it will bring a smile to their faces; something my Dad tried to do every day he was at the hospital.'




### HEAD OF ART MRS KOONER - SANDHU

In art lessons, we aim to open inquisitive minds through creativity, self-expression and experimentation using materials and techniques often involving modern technologies, including digital art, alongside more traditional methods, such as, printmaking.

Students observe aspects of the world and consider social, cultural and political issues, both past and present.

Pupils learn how to create art independently that is individual, whilst working in a shared, creative space nurturing mutual respect and understanding.

Art lessons cover a broad range of issues, including race, gender and equality, and are a means of expressing and raising awareness of contemporary events, such as, the war in Ukraine. There are also lunchtime and afternoon art clubs and many competitions throughout the year.


