Maths and Science Block

Welcome to our re-designed Newsletter - the first issue for two years. What a challenging span of time it has been, sometimes it is hard to remember what school life was like pre-Covid. There have been a lot of changes at school, not least on the school site. Phase 1, of two major building projects, was finished in October 2020



when a brilliant new Maths and Science block, pictured above, was opened, followed by two suites of teaching areas in January 2022. Currently, our developers, Speller Metcalf, are well underway with Phase 2, which will bring a new Sports Hall, Post-16 block and a multi-use, all weather pitch ready for use in September 2022. Despite the many frustrations, sadness and losses of Covid, Campion has welcomed many positive improvements and has continued to grow and change.

New for Old

Many areas around the school have been refurbished. Part of the old technical block has been converted to a multi-purpose drama studio, complete with a new Grab n' Go food area, aptly named The Forge (see right).
