History Club Flushed with Success

In Autumn 2021, the Leamington History Group offered the school's history club an opportunity to conduct independent research into Leamington's connection to the abolition of slavery movement in 19th Century America.

Over nine months, in conjunction with Warwick University and using a variety of research sources, the group crafted an article, which has been included in a book written by the Leamington History Group to explain how the abolition movement came to Leamington to raise awareness of the injustices of the slave trade. The book was published this autumn and a donation of £300 has been awarded to Campion's History Club to use towards the promotion of history in schools. The project has been an incredible opportunity for the history club and has resulted in



a brilliant piece of writing which the Leamington History Club, Warwick University and the school are rightly proud of. Well done.

FOCUS ON HUMANITIES - HISTORY

Windrush Workshop

The Humanities team is bringing many current affairs and world news stories to the classroom. During Black History Month in October, Y8 history students took part in a workshop organised by English Teacher, Monica Brown, pictured right, about the Windrush generation.



HMT Empire Windrush, pictured below, is remembered today for transporting one of the first large groups of post-war West Indian immigrants to the United Kingdom. The ship carried 1027 passengers and two stowaways on a voyage from Jamaica to London in 1948. Of these, more than 800 passengers gave their last country of residence as, 'Somewhere in the Caribbean.' The Windrush's arrival has become symbolic of the generation of Commonwealth citizens who came to live in Britain between 1948

and 1971.



Students really enjoyed the workshop and it will be opened up to other year groups. Huge thanks to Monica Brown for this inspiring session.

Remembrance Day

To commemorate Remembrance Day, all students took part in a one-minute silence and, during form time, form tutors led discussions on "Why do we Remember?", which enabled staff and pupils time to reflect and remember the great sacrifices made.

MS NAWROT HEAD OF HUMANITIES


I am very proud of the Humanities team at Campion and it is a privilege to work with staff and students alike.

Y12 Biology students enjoyed an engaging and inspiring workshop about the heart, led by Professor Kevin Moffat, (pictured top left,) and Sujatha Menon from Warwick University.


Building on their GCSE knowledge of the heart structure, students learned about factors that can affect the development or 'dance' of the heart. They also discovered problems associated with the heart, in particular, sudden cardiac arrest, using the real-life examples of footballers, Christian Eriksen and Fabrice Muamba. Finally, individual groups created 3D models, prose and poetry to illustrate a variety of problems associated with the heart. Each group performed their creative writing at the end of the session.

Well done to all those who took part - everyone showed lots of enthusiasm and focus, towards the challenging task and subject matter. Thanks to Warwick University.

Flourish Mentoring

One-to-one mentoring support for girls aged 11-18. Nurturing self-esteem and mental wellbeing.

Since our last newsletter, we have carefully selected 16 students from years 7 and 8 to take part in Flourish's group course which will begin in the Spring term of 2023. We will continue to keep you updated on any forthcoming group courses throughout the next year.

Flourish are still able to offer students mentoring. This is a creative, early intervention programme, supporting girls aged between 11-18 years to flourish. This involves a range of activities including craft, videos, games, discussion-based tasks and take-home tools.

Year 10-11: will use their merit totals to contribute to the cost of their prom, leaver's hoodies and yearbook.




WHAT IS SMSC? HOW DOES IT AFFECT ME?


